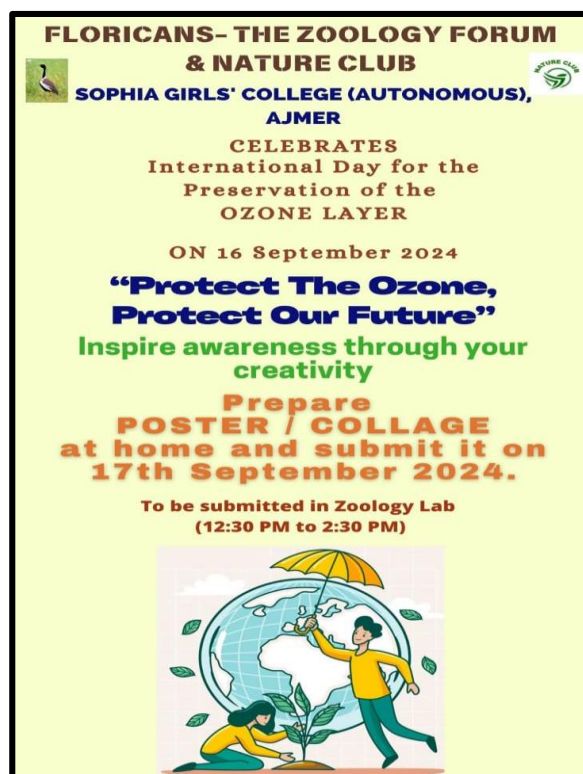
**Venue:** Jai Ambey Vridhashram, Ajmer

**Description:** The Nature Club and Floricans- Zoology Forum of Sophia Girls' College (Autonomous), Ajmer, organized an enlightening guest lecture on Animal Law on 5th October 2024. The session was conducted in the college auditorium and attended by students and faculty members with a shared interest in animal rights and environmental conservation. The guest speaker, Adv. Perna Sachin Yadav, a renowned advocate and animal rights activist, delivered an engaging talk on the legal frameworks and policies surrounding animal protection in India. Topics such as the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act, the Wildlife Protection Act, and ethical responsibilities towards animals were discussed. The speaker also highlighted the role of individuals in advocating for and upholding animal welfare.

The lecture was followed by a Quiz, where students were awarded with the certificates. The event concluded with a vote of thanks by the Nature Club president, expressing gratitude to the speaker and emphasizing the importance of understanding and implementing animal laws in daily life.

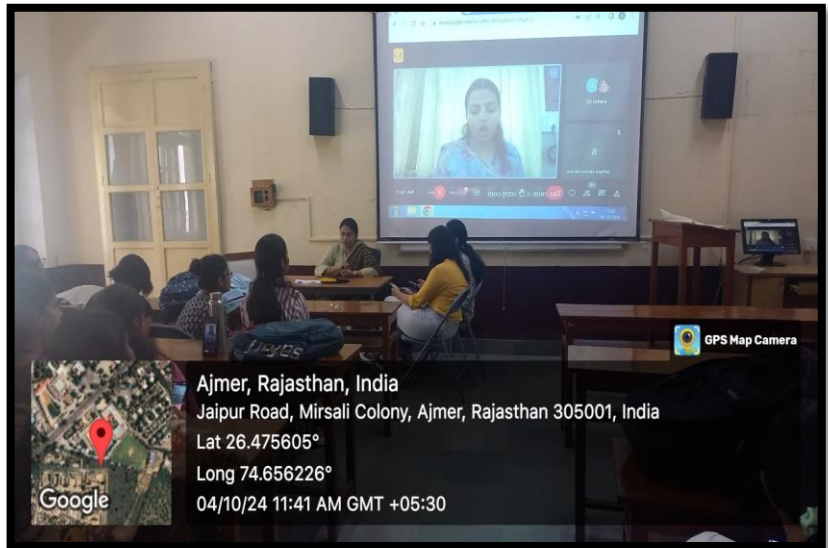
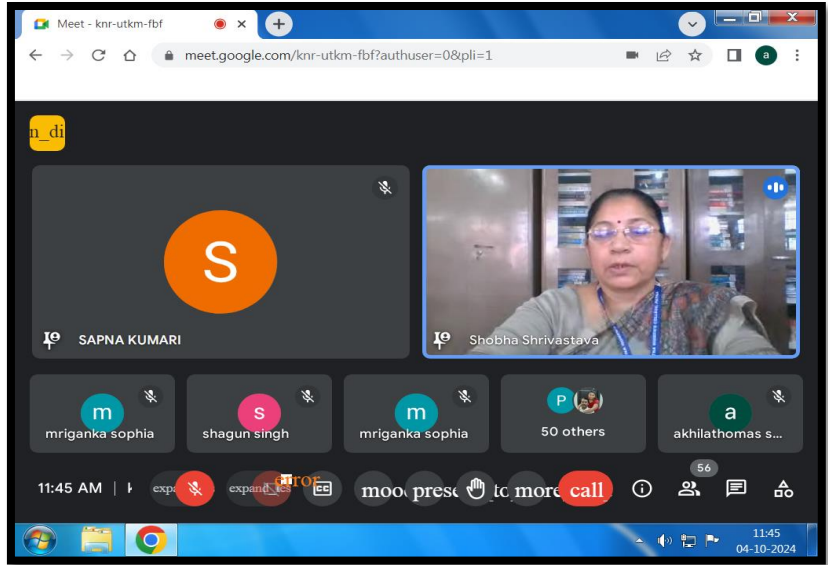
**Level of Event:** Inter College
